Danny Did Foundation Continues In Its Mission to Assist Families

As part of its ongoing mission to research and present technologies and devices that people afflicted by seizure disorders should be aware of, the Danny Did Foundation has subsidized 15 seizure alarm monitors for families spanning eight states.

The DDF has provided the Emfit Movement Monitor, which is available in Europe as a seizure detection and alarm system, to families across the U.S. --- from California to New Jersey--- as part of the DDF's mission to assist in the mainstreaming of seizure detection and prediction devices as well as other technologies that may assist in preventing deaths caused by seizures.

The monitor, currently undergoing clinical trials at three Chicago-area epilepsy centers, has been enthusiastically received by all of its recipients. Many of these families did not know about SUDEP until finding Danny Did and subsequent to learning about the foundation these families are sharing the DDF's message with doctors and other medical professionals in various parts of the country.

Danny Did Foundation's executive director, Tom Stanton, says that that is the empowering ability of an organization driven by a kid like Danny Stanton. "Danny was an in-your-face type of kid who loved to mug you with hugs. So full of life all of the time, he was, and that spirit and that energy are what drive us ---the DDF and Danny's parents Mike and Mariann--- to carry on in our mission to advance awareness of SUDEP and of possible ways to prevent SUDEP."

In addition to subsidizing monitors, the DDF has also to date sent out over 8,000 Seizure Safety/SUDEP Info brochures that have been co-produced with the Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Chicago.

About the DDF: Founded in January 2010 by Mike and Mariann Stanton after the Sudden Unexplained Death in Epilepsy (SUDEP) of their four-year-old son Danny, the Danny Did Foundation is dedicated in its mission to prevent deaths caused by seizures. The Danny Did Foundation holds as its main goals: (1) advancing awareness of Sudden Unexplained Death in Epilepsy (SUDEP) and enhancing the SUDEP communication model between medical professionals and those afflicted by seizures, and (2) the mainstreaming of seizure detection and seizure prediction devices as well as other technologies that may assist in preventing deaths caused by seizures.
